

Notice of race

Name of regatta: **Military Sailing World Championship**

Dates : **20 - 29 May 2005**

Venue : **Brest -Brest Bay - Poulmic inlet - FRANCE**

Organizing Authority: **Club Voile Ailée - Ecole navale Lanvéoc Poulmic**

Boats: **J 80 provided by the French Navy, under the responsibility of the Ecole Navale, with the support of the Federation Française de Voile (French sailing federation) and the classe J 80 France (J 80 class Association of France)**

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 No prescriptions of Federation Française de Voile will apply.
- 1.3 The General Regulations of CISM and Regulations of CISM for sailing will apply.
- 1.4 Night-time racing :
Between official sunrise and sunset, Chapter 2 of RRS rules shall not apply and shall be replaced with Part B of IRPCAS (COLREG).
- 1.4 J80 Class rules will apply with the exception of the following:
C4.3 will not apply. The outboard motor will not be embarked.
C4.2 will not apply. A first aid kit and instruction manual is not to be embarked.
- 1.6 Safety and equipment :
 - a- Safety equipment complying with new Maritime Affairs Regulations (sailing within 6 NM of sheltered areas, published 30 September 2004) and with J80 Class Rules is provided to the competitors, with the exception of portable VHF and portable GPS that competitors must bring.
 - b- Boats will not carry the first aid box which is required by the Maritime Affairs Regulations, however a doctor is standby for any emergencies.
 - c- The following navigation items: chart Shom n°7400P and tidal current charts are provided ; the sighting compass, plotters and dividers are authorized but not provided. Nothing else is allowed.

1.7 Assigning of Boats :

- a- Boats will be assigned by a draw the morning of Saturday 21 May 2005 with all teams present. The boats will be assigned for the duration of the event.
- b- Any procedure for replacement of a boat in case of serious breakdown will be by decision of the Race Committee.

2- ADVERTISING

The event is classed as Category C which means that according to article 20.3.2 of ISAF any advertising materiel is supplied by the Organizing Authority.

3 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 The regatta is open to all nations invited by CISM. J80 sailing boats will be used.
- 3.2 Nations can enter by filling in the form provided by the Organizing Authority. The deadline for applications is the 1st April 2005 (In accordance with the letter of invitation).
- 3.3 Competitors must have with them their military and civilian identity documents.

- 5.2 The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race each day is : **11h00.**

6 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing Instructions will be distributed on Friday 20 May during the registration procedure in Brest.

7 THE COURSES

The courses will be Windward-Leeward and inshore.

8. SCORING

8.1 Point System: the Low Point System will apply (RRS A4)

Scoring will be based on true time finishing positions.

8.2 Regatta scoring :

All races will have coefficient 1

If there is a tie between several competitors, RRS A8 shall apply to resolve the tie.

8.3 3 races are required to be completed to constitute a series.

8.4 Scores

a- When fewer than 6 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

b- When 6 races or more have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

9 HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS

Boats shall not be hauled out during the regatta except with and according to the terms of prior written permission of the race committee.

10 RADIO COMMUNICATION

A boat shall neither make radio transmission while racing nor receive radio communication not available to all boats.

The use of mobile telephones by crew members is strictly forbidden from the time the boat is leaving her berth until she is back alongside.

11 PRIZES

Prizes will be given as follows :

11.1- Challenge CISM

The CISM Cup will be presented to the winner of the Championship, who will keep it for one year.

11.2- Medals

The official CISM Medals will be presented to the skipper and crews of the first three boats.

11.3 Good Sport Trophy

The Good Sport Trophy will be presented to the team with the best fair behaviour during the regatta.
